The Many Hats of Supervision, an enjoyable 40-hour interactive workshop, focuses on **the functions, strategies, and logistics of supervision** in social work and counseling practice. Professionals may also take this course strictly for 40 hours of continuing education, including three hours of ethics.

The **Texas State Board of Social Worker Examiners (TSBSWE)** and the **Texas State Board of Examiners of Professional Counselors** have approved the Texas State School of Social Work to offer The Many Hats of Supervision to prospective board-approved supervisors.

After taking this training course:

- Social workers licensed as LCSWs will be eligible for certification to clinically supervise LMSWs who wish to pursue independent practice as LCSWs.
- Social workers licensed at any level will be eligible for board approval to provide non-clinical supervision to LMSWs or LBSWs who wish to pursue the Independent Practice Recognition.
- LPCs will be eligible to become board-approved supervisors.

Participants will:

- study case scenarios
- view instructive films
- participate in mind-stretching exercises
- develop creative supervision strategies
- learn from experts
- gather insights from each other
- take home a notebook of 150 pages of colorful, interesting, thought-provoking written materials on supervision topics

The Many Hats of Supervision is divided into three units.

Unit I, Creating Your Supervision Hats (16 hours)

Friday, January 8, 8:30 a.m. - 12:30 p.m. and 1:30 - 5:30 p.m.

Topics:

- Dynamics, stages, and models of supervision
- Logistics of creating, funding, and sustaining independent practice
- Legal principles, ethical standards, and professional boundaries of supervision
- Requirements of the state of Texas for supervision
- Supervision contracts and measurable goals
- The distinctions between supervising case managers and supervising clinicians
- Self-care and secondary traumatization
- Cross-cultural issues
- Core supervisory skills and how to be creative in using them
- Supervising over distance by electronic means

This unit is offered online and consists of application exercises and discussion sessions conducted independently between January 11 and February 12. *To complete Unit III, participants must have reliable access to a computer with a CD/DVD ROM drive and an Internet connection, a working e-mail address, and at least rudimentary computer skills to participate and perform the required tasks.*

This workshop is led by the well-qualified, knowledgeable faculty of the Texas State School of Social Work, under the direction of **Dr. Dorinda Noble**, a board-approved supervisor who has conducted many supervisory workshops in various states, and **Mr. Andrew Marks**, who has a great deal of experience in training and overseeing supervisors. Both Dr. Noble and Mr. Marks have many years of experience in state regulation of social workers. Other faculty members with notable experience also will present valuable information on supervision and management throughout the workshop.
